South America is a diverse continent meaning the climate and physical geography differ.

South America contains 12 countries including Argentina, Chile and Bolivia.

Most of Brazil is 3 hours behind Greenwich Mean Time (GMT-3).

Chile is 4 hours behind Greenwich Mean Time (GMT-4).

Some main cities in Brazil are Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo.

The Amazon Rainforest is the world's largest tropical rainforest.

It is an important physical feature because the trees keep carbon within them and release oxygen into the atmosphere.

The rainforest is connected by the Amazon river which is one of the longest rivers.

Rainforests are found near to the equator between the tropic of Cancer and the tropic of Capricorn.
