



What are the negative impacts of bullying?

Word	Definition
bystanders	Someone who is present when something takes place but does not take part in it
persistent	Lasting a long time and happening more than once
exclusion	Leaving someone out
rumours	Saying things about others that are not true
deliberate	Something done on purpose
respect	An act of giving attention or showing you care
prevention	Stopping something from happening

Reasons why some people are bullied: because their differences such as their likes or dislikes, **the way they look** or what they believe, race, gender etc.

Key Knowledge and Concepts

It is wrong to be unkind to someone or bully them because they are different.

Keeping bullying a secret helps people who are bullying to carry on with their behaviour.

Bullying is being deliberately unkind on a number of occasions.



Those who bully often use power over others.



Cyberbullying can include: the **misuse of mobile phones**, receiving a nasty message on a children's social networking site.

Indirect forms of bullying can include: exclusion, **giving people nasty looks, laughing and talking about someone behind their back.**
