Word	Definition
population	The number of living people that live together in the same place.
tourism	The act of travelling, usually for sightseeing or relaxing.
human geography	This looks at where people live, what they do and how they use the land.
physical geography	The study of the Earth's natural features.
lake	A large body of water that is surrounded by land.
National Park	A protected area of countryside
hills	A landform that is higher than the surrounding ground and smaller than a mountain.
economy	The way money is made and spent in a set area.
grid reference	A standard method for the location of a point on a map.

Key Knowledge and Concepts

East Midlands is a region containing 5 counties called Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and Rutland.

Cumbria is a county in North West England.

Cumbria and the East Midlands have similar human geography but the distribution of rural and urban areas differ.

Cumbria is mostly rural and contains the Lake District National Park which is a UNESCO world heritage site.
