Key Knowledge and Concepts

The risks involved within being on line include:

- cyberbullying
- posting private Information
- phishing and falling for scams
- accidentally downloading malware
- posts that come back to haunt a child later in life
- theft of information

To keep your online profile safe you should: never give out your password, do not post your address, full name, school etc only talk to people that you know, make sure security settings on your device at set.

The acronym SMART stands for - safe, meeting, accepting, reliable, tell.

If you are unhappy with something they see or something that happens on line for example: telling a trusted adult, use the whistle or similar 'report abuse' button.

Private information includes your full name, date of birth and address.



**Be smart on the internet**

**S SAFE** Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information – such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name – to people you are chatting with online.

**M MEETING** Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.

**A ACCEPTING** Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!

**R RELIABLE** Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are.

**T TELL** Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online. You can report online abuse to the police at [www.thinkuknow.co.uk](http://www.thinkuknow.co.uk)
