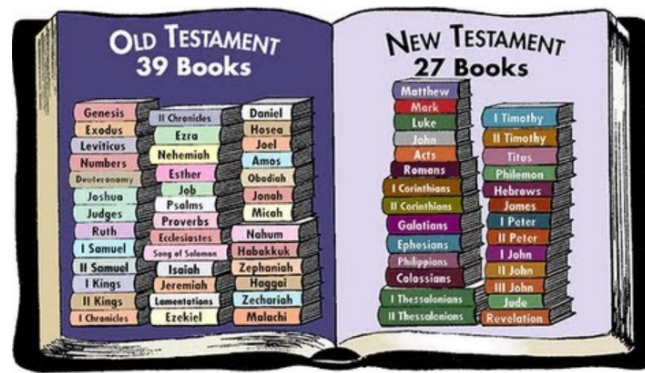
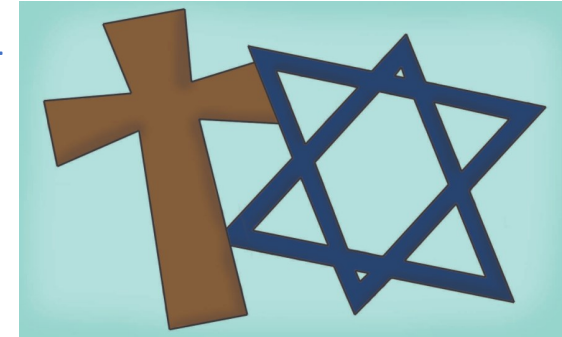
Key Knowledge and Concepts

Christianity originated from Judaism and Jesus was Jewish.

Christianity as a religion began after Jesus' death.

The bible is split into two parts: The Old Testament and The New Testament.

The Old Testament comprises of the 24 books of the Jewish Tanakh (Jewish Holy Texts).



Genesis is the first book of the Bible and the 1st book of the Torah (part of Tanakh).



The Judeo-Christian creation story happened in 7 days.

Judaism, Christianity and Islam are known collectively as the Abrahamic religions. They trace their common origin to Abraham/Prophet Abraham/Ibrahim. Abrahamic religions believe in one God.

In the Sikh holy book, the Guru Granth Sahib, creation is described by the Gurus but it is not a creation story similar to those found in Abrahamic religions or Hinduism.

Buddhists do not believe in God or have a creation story.
