The Romans lived in Rome, a city in Italy.

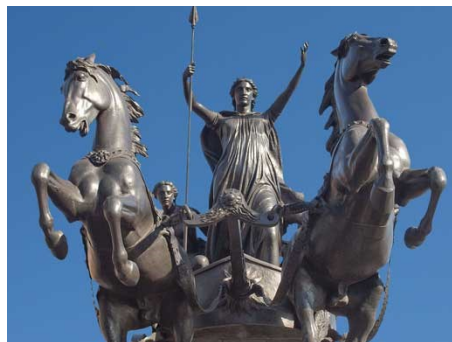
