Artist: Georgia O'Keeffe

Georgia O'Keeffe is an American artist, who is famous for her simple floral designs, that focused on shapes and lines found in the natural world. She drew close ups of flowers, to enable people to see nature in a different way.

Skills:

Experiment with different effects and textures including watercolours, washes, thickened paint creating textural effects. Use a range of paintbrushes to create different textures and lines. Create different effects and textures by mixing paints and water.

Mix colours and know which primary colours make secondary colours and how to adapt the tones of colours.

Final Outcome:

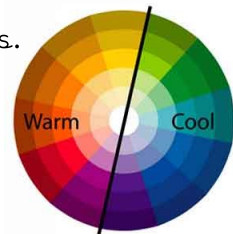
After observing the lines, patterns and textures in flowers, apply your new knowledge of mixing warm and cold colours, to create a watercolour painting in the style of Georgia O'Keeffe.



Mixing tones:

You can mix primary colours to create different tones of warm and cold colours.

Add black to make them darker or add white to make them lighter.



Observational Drawings

Experiment with drawing flowers from different angles, use a magnifying glass to see the detail.
